looting. Many have fled the area leaving behind the little they have. Those that stayed are fighting to take back their city and towns. Haiti needs a better future. We believe it will be the youth who will need to help build it.



HHH has prioritized food relief efforts in addition to our goat program to help us get through this very horrible time.



Please stand beside us with our brothers and sisters in Haiti! We have been working with and supporting Haitian family our since 2012. We work side by side with them on goat raising, education, economic, faith, community, and


future building to name a few. Today we deal with a different kind of Haiti and an even more dire situation. We have remained safe in our remote villages of Haiti until March 31, 2025. Because of political unrest, and the gangs looting, killing and raping the people, we are now in crisis mode. Many have fled their homes with nothing but the tattered clothes on their back for fear of life. Our focus has shifted to survival and keeping our brothers and sisters in Haiti alive. We are sending relief efforts in the form of food and hygiene products to help sustain them until their future brightens. Please help us help them.



CAN A GOAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

The short answer is YES!!! We don't claim to be the first to bring goats to Haiti but we did build a program to educate our Haitian brothers, sisters, and children on how to properly care for a goat to achieve optimal health and success. We have seen the difference this education and constant training has made in the 12 years our HHH program has been working in our remote mountain villages. Goats have become a savings account, a way to pay for educational expenses, a source of food, a source of income, how medical emergencies are covered, a new roof, a funeral, the ability to purchase additional livestock, and the list goes on. Employing skilled Haitians to run the program in country has been key. Boots on the ground, visits to each community with vaccinations, and the constant contact with the goat farmers when questions or concerns arise have all been ingredients in the success of the goat program. The success of our program has meant the success of our people and for this we are grateful!
